

## Literacy

Follow or create a set of instructions. (If you are writing instructions, they could help someone to make the pirate treasure chest you built at home.) You could add pictures or photographs too.

## Maths

Investigate shape. You could go on a shape hunt looking for 2D or 3D shapes, make a picture from 2D shapes or a model from 3D shapes, make shapes with straws or play dough or print with objects to see the shapes that are made.

## Geography

Have a look at a map of the UK. Find out which countries make up the United Kingdom. You could make flags or sports shirts to represent the countries, make a travel brochure or a simple fact file.

## PSHE /R.E.

The value for this half term is 'service'. Think of practical ways that you could help others. Challenge yourself to put one of these into action for at least a week e.g. keep your bedroom tidy, help to dry up, help to unpack the shopping, sweep up the leaves in the garden or any other ideas you can think of.

## Science
