School day timings

School begins at **8.40 am**. It is important that your child is not missing the first part of their school day. This is when key learning takes place and ensures that teachers can begin the morning calmly with no interruptions. Unless it is absolutely essential, pupils should not be being collected early during the school day. Appointments should be scheduled for outside school hours or in the holidays if at all possible.

Uniform

Attendance

Lateness

Arriving to school on time is as important as attendance. The doors open at 8.40am and children are expected in 8.50am. If your child arrives after this time then they will receive a late mark on the register (L). The registers will close up to 30 minutes until school has started. If your child arrives after this time, they will receive a mark on the register that shows them to be onsite but does not count as a present mark and will mean that they have unauthorised absence (U) unless a reason has been given.

From 19th August 2024 the DfE stated that penalty notice fines will be considered when there have been 10 sessions of unauthorised lates in a 10-week period. This is classed as irregular attendance. Lateness will be closely monitored by school staff to ensure that pupils do not fall into this timeframe.

We want to work together to improve attendance for all our pupils for better outcomes.
